Target Population

70 years+ @ 4-7 on frailty scale (below) or those with complex chronic conditions

- 1. Very fit
- 2. Well-without active disease
- 3. Well-with treated comorbid disease
- 4. Apparently vulnerable
- 5. Mildly frail
- 6. Moderately frail
- 7. Severely frail

- \downarrow Costs related to Unplanned Admissions
- ↓ Issues and barriers for minority, marginalized seniors



Comox Valley Model of Care




Some of what we know:
