

First Nations Prescription Drug Coverage

On October 1, 2017 First Nations Health Authority (FNHA) transitioned prescription drug coverage to British Columbia's PharmaCare from the federal government's Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB) program. The new Plan W was specifically developed for our FNHA clients.

To ensure continuity of therapy, transition period was set-up for clients who should be registered with a provincial agency to receive the related prescription drug coverage. We are encouraging clients to speak with their physicians regarding registration as soon as possible. The specific agencies are:

- BC Centre for Excellence in HIV/AIDS
