Our Division is working together with the Comox Division to bring **Pathways** to our physician communities. Pathways is an online resource that allows GPs and their office staff to quickly access current and accurate referral information, including wait times and areas of expertise, for specialists and specialty clinics. In addition, Pathways makes available hundreds of patient and physician resources that are categorized and searchable. Access to Pathways is currently limited to GPs and/or NPs (and their staff) within British Columbia who are members of a Division of Family Practice, as well as specialists who fall within the geographic boundaries of these Divisions.

Pain Management and Opioid Prescribing

In 2016, the BC College of Physicians and Surgeons announced new <u>opioid</u> <u>prescribing standards</u> in response to the growing opioid crisis in the province. To assist physicians in complying with these standards, and support them in their conversations with patients around pain management and opioid prescribing, a list of local and provincial resources has been compiled for the <u>provincial division</u> <u>website</u>.

This includes <u>A Guideline for the Clinical</u> <u>Management of Opioid Use Disorder</u>
(BC Centre on Substance Use and Ministry of Health), and information on the Practice Support Program's <u>Pain Management</u> <u>module</u>

Real-time access to Addiction Medicine Specialists

Also supporting primary care practitioners in the opioid crisis is <u>Rapid Access to</u>

<u>Consultative Expertise (RACE)</u>

GPs, NPs, and residents can access quick, real-time specialist advice via telephone or app (depending on location) in 25 specialty services, including Addiction Medicine. This specialty provides expert advice on management of substance use disorders, such as: (1) Pharmacological management of opioid use disorder including buprenorphine / naloxone inductions (2) Alcohol relapse prevention medications (3) Alcohol withdrawal management.
