In the fall of 2016, the Campbell River and District and Comox Valley Divisions of Family Practice supported a request of the Rural and Remote Division of Family Practice for a Shared Care Expression

of Interest grant to conduct a needs assessment and develop a project proposal to improve access to a comprehensive set of MHSU services in the rural communities of Cortes, Quadra, Hornby and Denman Islands and Gold River. This August the grant was approved and work will begin in the fall through to March, 2019 with the Campbell River and District Division as the lead agency in this joint project.

Through a cooperative approach between GPs, psychiatrists, patients and families, community agencies and Island Health, this project is focused on increasing patient and provider access to services, improving coordination of services and building system capacity inclusive of prevention, early intervention, crisis response and ongoing care. The goal of the work is to support a sustainable and scalable rural model of longitudinal care.
