#### Patient Attachment Mechanism Explained

Patients looking for a primary care provider call the A GP for Me Hotline at 604-795-0034 or Toll Free at 1-844-795-0034 to get to the Patient Attachment Mechanism (PAM). Once the patients are screened and determined to be truly unattached, patients fill out the Intake Form, Pharmanet Consent Form and if needed, the Narcotic Agreement Form. Once they fill out the forms, they are a patient of the Primary Care Clinic. Intake forms are then reviewed and triaged through the PAM and booked with a family doctor or nurse practitioner for a 20-minute Meet and Greet, depending on urgency. Following this, care is organized for patients who either remain in the clinic permanently or are referred out to a family doctor in the community.
