<u>Asthma in Children - Diagnosis and Management</u> - provides guidance on asthma diagnosis and management for patients aged 1-18 years.

Asthma in Adults - Recognition, Diagnosis and Management – provides guidance on asthma diagnosis and management for adult patients aged \geq 19 years.

SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT

IHA Restructure puts emphasis on primary and community care

President & CEO Chris Mazurkewich unveiled the <u>IHA restructure</u> late last year, including amalgamating 3 of the 4 current portfolios under <u>one led by</u> <u>Susan Brown</u>. All to enable IHA to more effectively govern ministry direction for greater emphasis on primary and community care.

In an email to all staff in mid January, Mr. Mazurkewich outlined the five strategies that are to be IHA's top priority over the next three years, including:

- 1 Enhance access to appropriate primary health care.
- 2 Improve primary and community care outcomes and delivery for complex chronic conditions and frail clients.
- 3 Improve primary and community care outcomes and delivery for mental health and substance use clients.
- 4 Improve timely access to elective surgery.
- 5 Implement a renewed system of care to improve access and service quality across rural and remote communities, including continuing to build relationships with First Nations to ensure health care is provided in a culturally safe and sensitive way.
