

Information for Coordinated Care Project Update

Starting late September ... electronic notifications about emergency department registrations, in-patient transfers, discharges and deaths will be sent from Fraser Health to family physicians.

ICC Project Background

The availability of patient encounter information from Fraser Health to family physicians is currently limited. The physician community has expressed a strong desire to improve communications regarding patients in support of better coordinated care. The Information for Coordinated Care (ICC) Project is working to improve and support patient-centred care via electronic delivery of Fraser Health acute care data to family physicians Electronic Medical Record (EMR) systems.

How will the ICC solution work?

The solution implemented by the ICC Project will deliver to physician EMRs: select emergency data and inpatient admission, discharge, transfer (ADT) notifications, and death notifications from Fraser Health. The data flow will involve ADT notifications from Fraser Health Meditech being sent to the appropriate provider's EMR via the Excelleris results distribution service.

ICC Project Update

The ICC project team consulted the Joint Interdivisional-Fraser Health IM/IT Working Group to identify and determine which acute data is required. The family physicians on this group drove the development of a useful data set.

Final deployment preparations are currently underway and the go-live is anticipated for September 22, 2016.
