On June 26th, the BC Minister of Health announces swift progress on PrEP program. At the press event, the Minister of Health announced that the province has seen strong uptake of PrEP as the program continues to grow. Currently there are about 100 new PrEP prescriptions filled each week, with new prescribers also joining at a steady rate across the province. The Canadian Medical Association commissioned Ipsos to examine the state of public opinion in Canada today as it relates to:

Recruitment of 200 New Physicians - Fact Sheet

On May 24, 2018 the Minister of Health announced funding for new Alternative Payment contracts to be offered to up to 200 new family physicians over three years. The goal is to encourage new doctors (mostly new grads) into community based longitudinal practice in a way that increases attachment and helps support the implementation of Primary Care Networks (PCNs). Those physicians will work side-by-side with Fee-for-Service (FFS) physicians in clinics or in newly formed group practices with other contracted GPs.

Update to No CPR Form

The Ministry of Health has updated the No CPR form with revised contact information for patients to order their MedicAlert No CPR bracelets. Users must now mail a completed MedicAlert form and a copy of their completed No CPR form to the MedicAlert address listed on the form in order to receive a No CPR bracelet or necklace.

Patients must receive both the front and back sides of the form to ensure they have all necessary information and instructions.
