Dr. Stefanie Green and Dr. Konia Trouton will provide an introduction to performing assessment and provision of MAiD. They will review current interpretation of eligibility criteria and, through a number of case scenarios, allow participants to develop an approach to interview and evaluation techniques. Participants will also be introduced to resources for more complex assessments, and an outline of the provision of MAiD.

Upon completion of the presentation, participants will be able to:

- 1. Explore the topic of MAiD with patients and families
- 2. Assess patients for MAiD
- 3. Recognize when social and medical factors may add a complexity
- 4. Explain and administer the medications
- 5. Perform a smooth MAiD process with families
- 6. Apply the federal reporting requirements in their context
- 7. Demonstrate plan for self-care and ongoing education in this field

Family physicians, Practicing Specialists, and Nurse Practitioners who are interested in learning how to provide assessments and provision of medical assistance in dying for appropriate patients.
