Approach to Suspect COVID-19 Cases Presenting in a Community Setting

- Does the patient have <u>any</u> of the following symptoms?

 Fever (temp > 37.5 degrees Celsius)

 Cough (new onset or exacerbation of chronic cough)

 Difficulty breathing/shortness of breath
- AND
- Severe respiratory illness, or likely to be hospitalized, **OR** A Health Care Worker, **OR**
- A resident of a long-term care facility, OR
- Part of an investigation of a cluster or outbreak
