

SOS Division welcomes new Board Directors

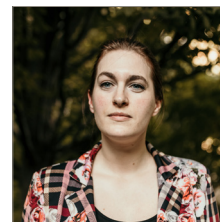
The SOS Division of Family Practice is pleased to have welcomed five new directors to its board in September.

New website highlights local maternity care options for your patients

It's now much easier for expectant mothers living in Penticton and the surrounding area to choose the type of maternity care that's right for them.

A new website, Maternity Services in the South Okanagan Similkameen (www.pentictonmaternity.com) lists maternity care clinics, providers and support workers in our region including midwives, family physicians who deliver, obstetricians, doulas, public health nurses and perinatal social workers.

The website also provides information about the type of pregnancy, birth and newborn care they each offer and how to access them.

noting that the website includes information for expectant mothers in communities such as Peachland and Princeton who will deliver in Penticton.

Business cards with the website address, which can be handed out to patients, will soon be distributed to family physician offices.

This website was created as part of a larger project, facilitated by the SOS Division of Family Practice, which brought together family physicians, midwives, obstetricians, paediatricians, patients, Interior Health and other care providers, to develop a community approach to maternity care in our region.

Dr. Lawrie's travelling road show: How to create a plan for patient deprescribing

Thanks to presentations by Dr. Mark Lawrie, numerous physicians in our region are learning new strategies for reducing medication usage in our frail elderly.

The presentations include a how-to practical component, where participants work through case studies and come up with plans for deprescribing.

"We're taught how to prescribe medications, but not so much how to deprescribe or taper down



medications," says Dr. Lawrie.

Participants also leave with a Medication Discontinuation Planner, which can be used as a guide for building deprescribing plans for their patients.

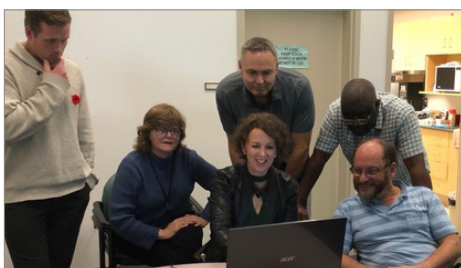
The presentations, which took place

in Penticton, Keremeos, Princeton and a multi-disciplinary long term care conference in Vernon, have all been well received.

"People really appreciated learning how to go about actually reducing medications," says Lisa Needoba, residential care project lead.

Physicians recruiting health care providers into their clinics

The SOS Division is assisting physicians with integrating healthcare providers, such as LPNs and pharmacists, into their practice, using the current fee-for-service model.

Fairview Medical Clinic is the most recent clinic in Penticton to have a pharmacist visit their office to conduct

medication reviews with patients.

In addition, LPNs are increasingly being hired into physician offices to help physicians save time and improve patient care.

SOS Division Recruitment Team working alongside physicians to recruit new primary care providers

The SOS Division recruitment committee is working closely with physicians in our community to identify the recruitment needs of individual offices, create new opportunities for recruitment, and develop an interactive site for potential primary care providers to discover a practice that suits their individual interests.

Alongside physicians on the committee, our SOS Division team works to attract and retain physicians in our area. On the team are: Julie Young, who coordinates member services, Riley Gettens and Kelly Hawes.

Gettens takes the lead on creating community connections for the physician and family; Hawes helps match potential physicians to the type of practice of interest to them, and helps new physicians settle by assisting them with practicalities such as obtaining privileges, and answering questions around billing and clinic set-up.

As part of the overall recruitment strategy, the team is also coming up with a planned retirement package for local physicians. This will include a retirement checklist, suggestions on ways to enhance a practice so that it's attractive to new physicians, and tools for letting patients and the community know about an impending retirement.
