The usual duties had evolved to act like gatekeepers of the office.



#### Panel Management

Panel management is a process of proactively managing a defined population of patients, using EMR data to identify and respond to patients' chronic and preventative care needs. The concept is simple: better information about patients leads to better care for patients.

The phases of panel management is a framework designed to support doctors as they work to provide longitudinal, proactive care to their patients. An accurate panel means doctors can easily track billings, improve their workflows, improve communications with patients, and maintain a better work-life balance.

The three-phase approach to panel management helps doctors:

- 1. Improve practice workflow efficiencies.
- 2. Identify others who can help family doctors care for their patients.
- 3. Inform and plan proactive care.

Family practice teams can receive payment for up to 15 hours in total to participate in each phase of panel management. Once three phases have been completed, family doctors will receive a \$3,000 bonus payment.





Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications
Commission (CRTC) have announced a nationwide 3-digit
suicide prevention hotline launching next year

988 will be available nationwide and around the clock.

Canadians who need immediate mental health crisis intervention will be able to text or call 988 and obtain counselling in the fall of next year.

Starting at the end of November 2023, calls and texts to 988 will be directed to a mental health crisis or suicide prevention service, free of charge, once the number is implemented by telephone and wireless service providers.

"The implementation of 9-8-8 as an easy-to-remember three-digit number will help reduce barriers to mental health and suicide prevention resources.

#### Roe v. Wade - Canadian Impact

Canadian experts say that striking down Roe v. Wade is a devastating setback to reproductive rights with potentially wide-reaching implications. Outlawing abortion won't stop people from terminating pregnancies, but it will make it riskier and more expensive, said Roopan Gill, an OB-GYN with Médecins Sans Frontières and the University of Toronto. "The people who are going to suffer most from this are not wealthy, white, cis-hetero women. It's going to be Black women, people of colour, people with low-socioeconomic status, LGBTIQ."




