Chronic Pain & Problematic Substance Use Program

8 week program for Chronic Pain and Problematic Substance Use

In response to the opioid crisis, the Fraser Health is partnering with local Divisions of Family Practice to develop new services for people with co-morbid chronic pain and problematic substance use (including prescription drug use). As a result, a specialized community based program has recently opened in the North Surrey area, in Surrey, collocated with an Urgent Primary Care Centre. The program will serve people living in the Delta, Langley, Surrey, and White Rock areas. Priority will be given to people with opioid use disorder, who are high risk for developing opioid use disorder or at risk of relapse e.g. previous medical history of substance use (including prescription drug use).

- Primary care referrals or referrals via substance use services:
 - Discuss the program, willingness to participate and get consent
 - Assess severity with the Brief Pain Inventory
