COVID UPDATES

Since the beginning of the pandemic, your Division has been busy behind the scenes. Information changed hourly, daily and updates where emailed out as they became available to ensure physicians had easy access to the latest information. A COVID Family Physician Response Team was initialized and for a period of time, weekly Wednesday morning meetings for all our family physicians were held in order to disseminate information.

The people in our community were quick to step up to plate with PPE donations for our community clinics and we would like to thank the following:

- * Dr. Natasha Rafo for her assistance in procuring 100 3D Face Shields. These shields where a community effort and made by the Quadra Island Community Centre. The Shield Project brought together a number of businesses, local governments and individuals to assemble and package over 5,500 face shields for distribution in the healthcare system. The face shields that we received have now been delivered to all family physicians as well as to those specialists with a practice outside of the hospital.
- * Through a connection with Dani Daigle, NP with North Island Medical Clinic we received a donation of 1,000 masks from Spinners Sports and we were able to purchase an additional 1,000 at a discounted rate.
- * A local couple, Emily and Nathan Hollenberg, delivered 100 3D printed Ear Savers for masks to the Division which were then shared out to all physicians and clinic staff.
- * Shelter Point as soon as the pandemic hit, we worked with Shelter Point to purchase hand sanitizer which they then delivered to each clinic within our district.
- * Also individual clinics were willing to share their PPE supplies, so along with the general public, we thank all who donated gowns, gloves, eye protection, hand sanitizer & wipes, and masks.

eForms Update for Providers

Island Health's Health Information Management (HIM) department has implemented a new process to centralize the management of clinical forms. This includes a new intake, review, and approval process for the creation or modification of all clinical paper forms and eForms. The new procedure will enable us to, where appropriate, regionalize form content, support process harmonization and reduce the number of changes required to build the forms into Electronic Medical Record (EMR) systems.

All approved Island Health forms will be published into Pathways and templates will be created, which then can be uploaded into community EMRs, including Oscar/Juno, Wolf, MedAccess, and IntraHealth.

Clinic Health and Safety for Physicians and Staff Extensive list of online toolkits and online courses

- PICNet Guidelines/Toolkits
- On <u>WHO's Channel about COVID</u> Resources: all courses will validate a "record of achievement" to those who receive min. 70%, with 3 chances to attempt, with exception of IPC course (shows certificate of completion when 100% course material completed).
 - <u>Standard Precautions: Enviro Cleaning & Disinfection</u>: online course, approx. 1 hour. Will learn the role of an IPC professional in environmental cleaning and understand how cleaning and disinfection prevents contamination of the health care environment.
 - Decontamination and sterilization of medical devices: online course, 2 parts, 1 hour each. Will learn about the overall procedure for managing decontamination and sterilization of medical devices.
 - <u>Standard precautions: Waste management</u>: online course, approx. 1 hour. Will learn about the different categories of waste and the process for waste management.
 - Standard precautions: Hand hygiene: online course, approx. 1 hour.
 - Infection Prevention & Control (IPC) for COVID 19 Virus: online course, approx. 1 hour. This course will cover the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures required in order to: Be prepared and ready to respond to an outbreak, in particular, the one due to COVID-19; Limit human to human transmission by way of implementing WHO recommended IPC interventions; Identify, isolate and report suspect and confirmed cases.
- Alberta Health Services Resources: do not require login info to do online modules.
 - AHS PPE & You course: 30-45min online learning intended for both HCWs with direct patient
 contact and HCWs who have contact with the patient environment or patient equipment. It
 reviews the significance of PPE use and familiarizes HCWs with the various types of PPE,
 highlighting the importance of using a PCRA before every interaction to determine what PPE is
 required. Using practice scenarios, the module also outlines the specific processes required for
 PPE donning and doffing.
 - <u>Hand Hygiene</u>: 20 min online course.
 - Infection Prevention and Control Is Everyone's Business: 30-45 min online course provides a
 basic understanding of the AHS Infection Prevention and Control Program structure and role,
 basic IPC principles, and how those principles relate to every health care provider and their
 practice.

Centre for Rural Health Research in the Department of Family Practice at the University of British Columbia. We need your help to understand rural and remote B.C. communities' experiences of and responses to the COVID-19 pandemic through this <u>survey</u>.

Lifeguard APP

People in the Island Health region will now have access to a new overdose prevention tool, *Lifeguard App*. The app was developed in partnership with the Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA), regional health authorities and Lifeguard Digital Health to help save more lives and ensure people who use drugs alone have access to the supports they need. The App is activated by the individual before they take their dose. After 50 seconds the App will sound an alarm. If the individual doesn't hit a button to stop the alarm, indicating they are fine, the alarm grows louder. After 75 seconds a text-to-voice call will go straight to 9-1-1, alerting emergency medical dispatchers of a potential overdose.

This is one more tool available to prevent overdose deaths, particularly in the context of the dual public health emergency. For those who can't buddy up or connect with an overdose prevention or supervised consumption service, *Lifeguard App* may help.

In this consulting role, Cindy is able to help support the great care already happening in hospital and educate, alongside of the AMCS physicians, how to manage withdrawal and/or start OAT while patients receive their medical care, as well as help reduce/clarify misinformation or stigma that sometimes comes along with patients struggling with alcohol use disorder or substance use disorder.
