The GPSC is introducing a new, annual payment for community-based family physicians who work under fee-for-service and who care for a panel of patients.

Recognizing the long-term, relationship-based care family physicians provide to their patients, the Community Longitudinal Family Physician (CLFP) Payment also recognizes the additional, non-clinical responsibilities required to provide ongoing, coordinated care for which fee-forservice physicians are not compensated.

Updated Concussion E-Learning Course for Medical Professionals

The Concussion Awareness Training Tool for Medical Professionals (CATT MP) launched this June and an updated e-learning course is now available. The course will cover how to effectively assess a patient's concussion situation within the initial hours post-injury, how to optimally manage concussion care during the first two to four weeks post-injury, and how to identify when referral to specialty care is required.

The course is free-of-charge, available in both English and French, and is eligible for credits with the Maintenance of Certification (MOC) program through the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

Contemporary Topics in Early Antenatal Care: A Practical Course for Providers

This **free** interactive **online course** has been created for family doctors involved in any level of obstetrical care, with a focus on the first 20 weeks of pregnancy. Five modules cover a range of practical topics including aneuploidy screening, early bleeding management, management of hypertension, and much more. The program is certified by the CFPC for up to seven Mainpro+® credits.

Access is available 24/7 at: https://maternityelearning.cfpc.ca. Anticipated completion time for all five modules is seven hours and can be done over several visits. A certificate of participation is provided after each completed module. The course will be available until April 2020. This pilot is available in English only.

Routine Growth Monitoring in Infancy Study

A provincial, interdisciplinary research project titled Routine Growth Monitoring in Infancy is seeking physicians that engage in Routine Growth Monitoring to participate in this study by completing a brief online survey.

The purpose of this study is to better understand the risks and benefits of growth monitoring in infancy, which could have implications for practitioners, policy makers, and most importantly, for patients. Attached the **information and consent form** and the survey itself to provide you with more detailed information on the purpose and goals of the study. The survey will take approximately 2-3 minutes to complete. This study has Research Ethics Board approval from Interior Health, College of the Rockies, and the University of British Columbia.
