PATIENT QUALITY IMPROVEMENT ~ PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

Improving linkages between Acute Care and community providers for drug using patients and increase # of starts Opioid Agonist Therapy (OAT) on ED discharge

There are a number of our members who are engaging in Patient Quality Improvement work and we would like to spread the word!

Dr. Erika Kellerhals is in the process of a PQI project with an aim to make a seamless transition between acute and community services which will allow more patients to move to OAT resulting in better care for patients and reducing re-visits to the ED allowing for effective use of resources. She noted that, "for the last 2 years, we have been doing emergency Suboxone starts, but many patients are not completing this start and leaving the ED without being linked to any follow-up services in the community. There is missed opportunity to start OAT and to engage patients with services/rehab etc."

Right From the Start (RFTS)

Public Health is looking to increase the completion rate of the Right From The Start (RFTS) registration form by prenatal clients. To highlight this issue, from January to July of 2019, **up to 92% of the women that delivered in Campbell River did not receive or fill out the RFTS form** and therefore did not have early access to additional prenatal and postpartum information regarding physical and emotional support, breastfeeding support, family and community health referrals, child health clinics and immunizations, and Baby's Best Chance handbook.
