MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

I am pleased to submit the first Annual Report for the Central Interior Rural Division of Family Practice. The Division initiative was founded on the conviction that by working together, we can achieve broadbased enhancements to the delivery of primary care in our communities. The Central Interior Rural Division has come about due to the response to this belief from area Family Practitioners. Exploration of interest in the creation of a Division of Family Practice began in 2010 with 100 Mile House Physicians discussing the possibility of creating a of Division. Williams Lake Physicians were invited to a meeting to determine their interest in September 2011.

Our inaugural meeting and signing of Charter took place on April 23, 2012 with the incorporation of the newly formed Society on May 18, 2012. The first Board of Directors meeting & appointment of officers was July 16 2012 with the Coordinator position hired a month later. To begin our work determining the priorities in our own community for improving patient and physician satisfaction and to implement projects, the first Member Engagement Event was held in Williams Lake January 18, 2013. 20 members attended to discuss how the Division could have a positive effect on their professional life. The inaugural Collaborative Services Committee meeting took place May 2013.

2012-2013 HIGHLIGHTS

Recruitment

In February a contract of partnership was signed between the CIRD and the Cariboo-Chilcotin Regional Hospital District in support of Recruitment and Retention of Physicians and Health Professionals. Two Recruitment Liaison Coordinators, one for each Division community, have been hired and are hard at work developing the Recruitment Strategic Plan, creating marketing materials, arranging Physician site visits, attending medical conferences and job fairs promoting our area as a wonderful place to work. The Board agreed to represent the Divisions within Interior Health on the Inter-Divisional Strategic Council's Recruitment Environmental Scan initiative.

CME

Our first CME – an Emergency Department Ultrasound course takes place June 1 & 2 at the South Cariboo Health Centre in 100 Mile House. Sixteen Division Members are taking this course, developed by Dr. Ray Wiss. Over 2000 Canadian Physicians have already taken the EDE course, which is rated for 10 MainPro-C credits by the CCFP and 10 Section 1 credits by the RCPSC.

Member Engagement

Our first Member Engagement dinner meeting was January, 2013 in Williams Lake. A survey of Member interests and priorities indicated five areas of focus for the CIRD: Physician Recruitment, Patient Attachment, Mental Health Initiative, CMEs and Physician Engagement Events. Mental Health

Lead by Dr. Glenn Fedor, the CIR Division now has a Child & Youth Mental Health Working Group that includes a wide community representation from MCFD, School District #27, mental health & substance abuse staff, the Aboriginal Community and physicians/specialists. The purpose of the Collaborative is to improve timely access for an increased number of children, youth and their families to integrated mental health and substance use services. Partial Budget funding for this \$1.3 million initiative has been This group embodies the Divisions guiding Principles of community focus, inclusiveness, and collaboration.

The Division recently established an Attachment Working Group, led by Director Bruce Nicolson. We look forward to implementing the multi-faceted program that will increase Physician capacity and improve the delivery of health care services to our communities.


