The Division will provide support based on situational need. Supports could include, but are not limited to:

Networking between practices or assisting to find an alternate practice location that enables business continuity and continued patient care.

Assisting with privileging

Preparing for evacuation of patients and return of patients to facilities staffed by CIRD members, including LTC.

Liaising with regional incident command and clinics

In the event of an emergency at your clinic or during an evacuation, contact the CIRD to assess the situation and identify areas of support at info@cirdivision.ca

Conduit for information between relevant agencies

Sourcing PPE and supplies

Incident recovery supports to get your business back up and running after an emergency, in conjunction with relevant partners such as the Practice Support Program and Interior Health

In case of regional emergency, the CIRD will connect with the IH Health Emergency Management BC Coordinator, and sit on the local EOC as the representative and communication link between the Health Authority EOC and community primary care providers.
