Jim Pattison Outpatient Care and Surgical Centre (JPOCSC) Chronic Pain Clinic – Surrey

This is the main, tertiary pain centre for Fraser Health that provides the following services:

- Biopsychosocial Pain Management group programs and individual services
- Pharmacological management
- Interventional Procedures fluoroscopy, ultrasound
