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REPORT FROM THE CHAIR

The North Shore Division of Family Practice has had another busy and effective year in bringing primary care back to the centre of the health care system. We know that individual health — and the system itself — are best served when primary care is strong and fully integrated.

Our Division membership continues to grow. We now have 190 physician members and are delighted that this comprises essentially all North Shore FPs. Several months ago we welcomed eight residents to the Division. Through their tenure in the inaugural Coastal Family Practice Residency, these residents will make a significant contribution to the North Shore.

Over this past year, our members participated in a wide range of activities: board meetings, social events, working groups, focus groups, surveys, clinical initiatives, projects, and educational meetings. We are pleased to have so many great contributors and look forward to welcoming still more physicians into the work of improving primary care and the experience of family physicians.

Meeting the needs of our GP members remains a top priority. We accomplish this through our Supporting Ourselves Working Group and offerings like CME On the Run, CPR updates, billing optimization evenings, and our stellar holiday party.

Our Mental Health/Addictions Working Group, IT Working Group and various GP-Specialist initiatives have achieved clinical improvements. Additionally, our Health Connection Clinic now provides team-based primary care to vulnerable people with medical, mental health, and/or socio-economic challenges.

The past year was also busy with the assessment and proposal stage of our work within the province-wide A GP for Me initiative, also known as the attachment initiative. Our members provided critical data to ensure our plans to serve and strengthen the needs of unattached or poorly attached individuals will reflect interests specific to the North Shore.

The Division is strengthened by its health care partnerships. We are grateful to Coastal Community of Care, Vancouver Coastal, General Practice Services Committee (GPSC), Doctors of BC, Practice Support Program (PSP), Physician Information Technology Organization (PITO), Shared Care/Transitions in Care, other divisions, Lions Gate Hospital (LGH), BC Children's Hospital, nurse practitioners, specialist colleagues, the Physician Data Collaborative, Integrated Primary and Community Care, plus a host of practitioners and support people from many disciplines.

Fundamentally, the NS Division is about the people who forward the Division's mission.

We are grateful to Margaret English and Katharine Knowles for their historic work. We are excited to have Marnie Goldenberg as our interim Executive Director, Rachel Leigh as our Member Services and Administrative Coordinator, and to welcome our newest staff member Abigail Cameron as our Projects Lead. I also want to thank our Health Authority partners who work closely with us. Wendy Hansson, Sandra Edelman, Laurie Leith, Carole Gillam, Carol Park, and most recently Mike Nader, Coastal's new COO - they bring an ethos of collaboration to all that they do with us.

I am honoured to be part of a hardworking and

HIGH NEEDS/ UNATTACHED PATIENTS

- Improve the patient and provider experience through a sustainable system

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Health Connection Clinic launched July 2, 2013 — a high-needs, multidisciplinary clinic with outreach services; providing primary care to complex/ high-needs patients
- Defined NS high-needs/unattached population: 3,000 to 4,000 frequently using LGH ER and acute care services
- Developed online and laminated one-stop resource list noting key community and health care services
- Developed and launched Health Connection iPhone App (scalable across BC); includes practitioners and connecting resources
- Launch of www.healthconnectbc.ca website
- Provided ongoing evaluation of the performance and success of the Health Connections Clinic

 Decreased clients' emergency department visits, hospital admissions, average length of stay in hospital, and percentage of alternative level of care days


