REAKT is a personalized service for rural providers dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic. Volunteers respond to specific questions posed by providers, which may involve evidence review and summary, sourcing existing resources such as pre-printed order sets, or sharing ideas and innovations. Responses are rapid and sent directly to the provider making the request as well as contributing to an expanding online library of resources.
