

Northern Health Palliative Care ECHO

The Northern Health Palliative Care Consultation Team is providing virtual education and support for front line clinicians, using the Project ECHO Model[™]. ECHO provides an opportunity for clinicians to participate in case-based learning and education with a group of palliative care experts.

Each session will include a 10-15 minute didactic presentation and then the remainder of time will be spent discussing a case presentation allowing for participant questions and discussion. This format allows for connection to other clinicians across the north and also to the Palliative Care Consult Team.

- The time commitment with be **1 hour per session** plus a session evaluation.
- Participants will be asked to:
 - confirm audio and video access to Zoom before the first session
 - participate and present or discuss cases from their practice
 - complete a post session evaluation
