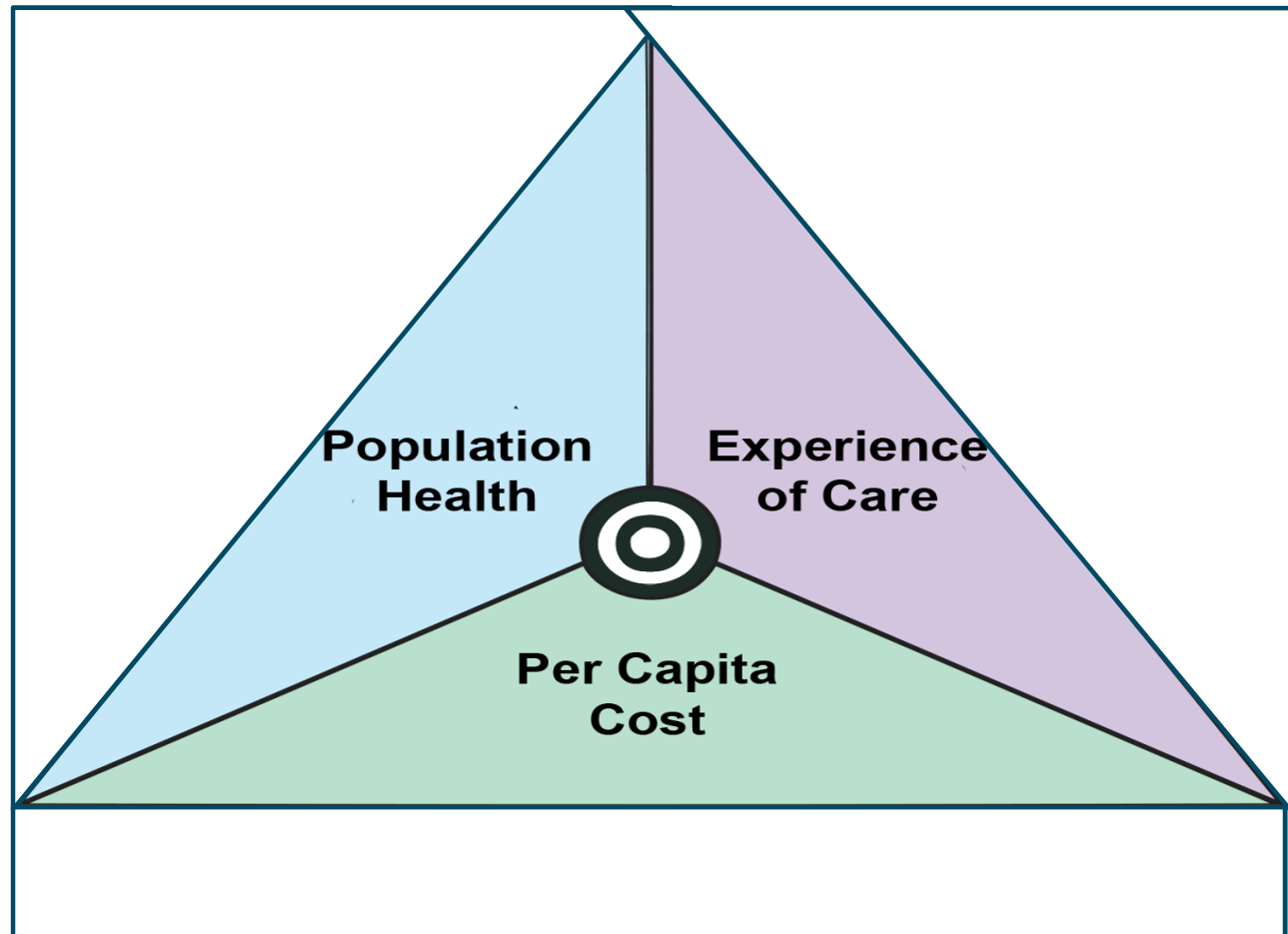

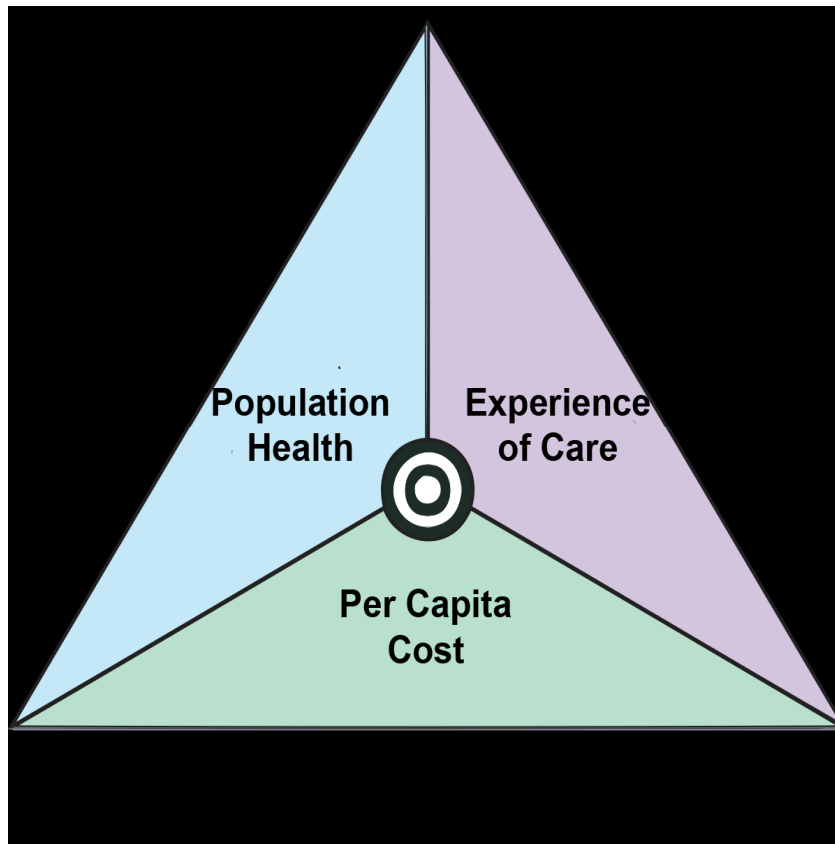

Triple Aim



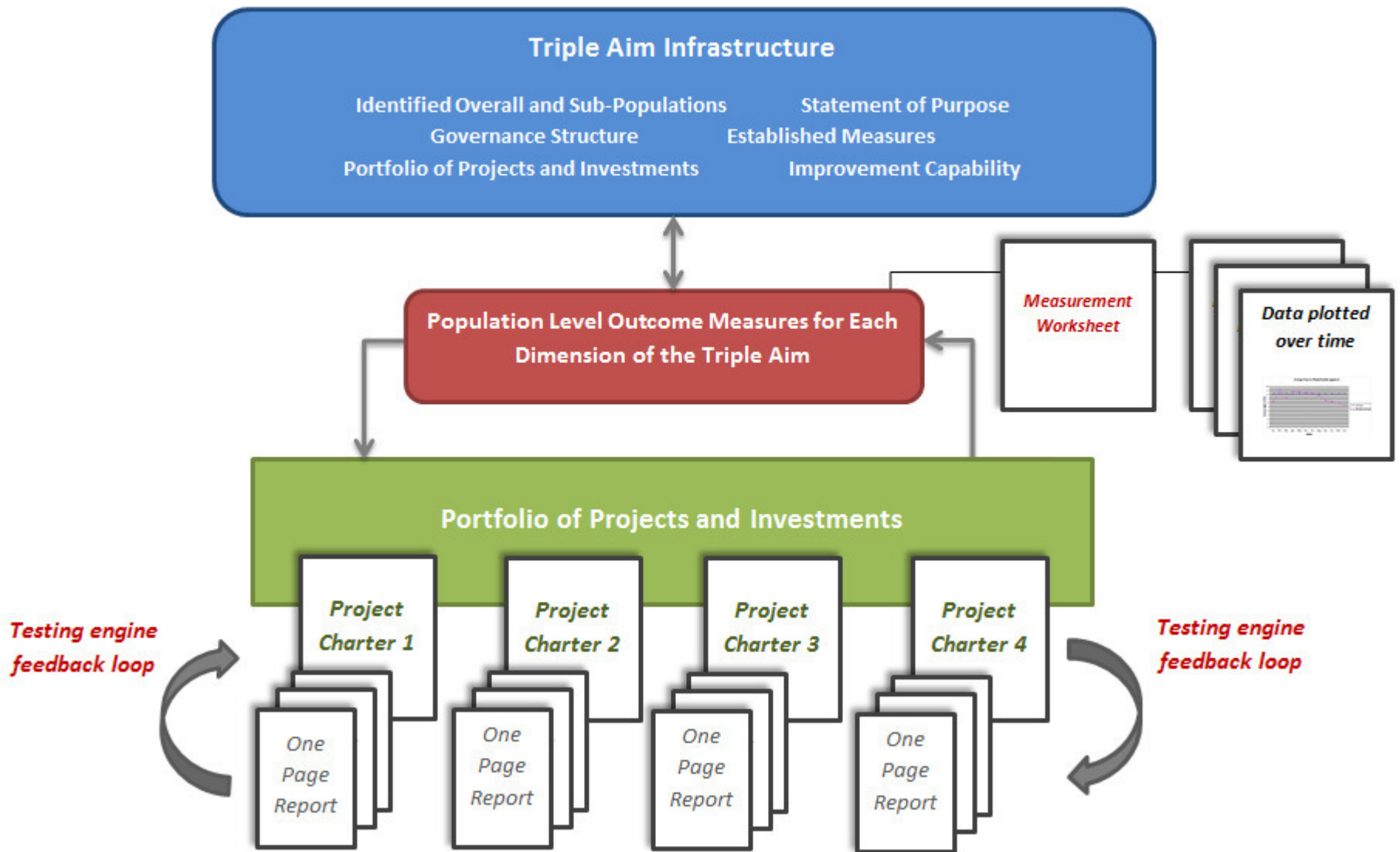
Triple Aim and the Goals of A GP for Me Comparison



- Confirm and strengthen the GP-patient continuous relationship – including the needs of vulnerable patients
- Enable patients what want a family doctor to find one
- Increase the capacity of the primary care system.

Who are our 'vulnerable' populations?

- Frail in community and residential care
- Cancer patients
- High needs complex/frail/chronic conditions
- Severe disability
- Mental health and substance use
- Mother/Baby dyads

Population Health:

Mortality – Person Years of Life Lost (PYLL) Rates
Prevalence/Onset of Major Chronic Conditions
Infant Mortality
Risk Status

Patient/Practitioner Experience:

Standard questions from “How’s Your Health” and other surveys.
Measures from key dimensions, e.g. safe, effective, timely, efficient, patient centred

Per Capital Cost (Scalability):

Hospital and E.D. Utilization Rates
