



Long Beach

Located on the west coast of Vancouver Island, the communities of Tofino and Ucluelet are just 30 minutes apart. Joined by the Pacific Rim National Park, and incorporating part of a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, they have become two of Canada's most sought-after tourist destinations. Ahousaht is an offshore community located northwest of Tofino, also served by local physicians. Including these and other local First Nations communities' physicians have an opportunity to work in a variety of communities, clinic settings, and at Tofino General Hospital. The region has a combined population of about 7000 year-round residents.

During the tourist season, the area population increases substantially. Comprised of a rugged and beautiful coastal landscape that includes old-growth rainforests, sandy beaches, inlet waterways and hot springs, bears, wolves, salmon and orcas are among the local wildlife. The geography also offers a relaxed and rewarding west coast lifestyle through a wealth of outdoor activities such as year-round surfing, stand-up paddle-boarding, hiking, kayaking, whale watching, fishing and storm watching adventures.

- Tofino and Ucluelet offer world-class restaurants, resorts, art galleries and cafes.
