Pemberton, BC, is a small but vibrant community nestled in the Coast Mountains, just 30 minutes north of Whistler. It offers a close-knit, welcoming atmosphere known for its stunning natural beauty, outdoor recreational opportunities, and rich agricultural heritage. Residents enjoy hiking, biking, skiing, and fishing surrounded by breathtaking mountain and valley views. The community is also home to a growing arts and culture scene and supports a sustainable, locally focused lifestyle.

People are drawn to live and work here for the peaceful environment, strong community spirit, and easy access to both nature and nearby urban amenities.


What We Offer:

- Pemberton (pop. 3400) is 160 km north of Vancouver, BC, along the scenic Sea-to-Sky Highway near Squamish and Whistler.
- Pemberton Medical Clinic is the community's sole primary care clinic, operated by a society with a board of directors. Open Monday – Friday, with 15-minute appts, Med Access EMR, and staffed by 8 full and part-time family physicians and 3 nurse practitioners. Serves pop. ~ 8,000-10,000 residents of the area.
- Adjoining the Pemberton Medical Clinic is Vancouver Coastal Health-operated Pemberton Health Centre. The health center provides emergency services out of the 4-stretcher Diagnosis and Treatment Centre on a “nurse first-call” basis in addition to diagnostic imaging, laboratory, mental health, public health, and home care nursing. After-hours physician coverage is compensated by the FFS payment model in addition to MOCAP and REEF payments.
- The 20-bed, Squamish General Hospital is 1.25 hours south of Pemberton.
