IH maintains a quarterly inventory of rural health research planned or underway across the region.

As of September 30th, there are 34 rural health studies underway: 7 in IH West, 17 in IH Central and 10 in IH East. The next e scan will be completed by December 31st. The *Community Research Lead* position was created to advance an aim of the **IH Research Strategy** (2014). **Recommendation 5:** *IH should support the development of Prevention and Rural/Remote Health Care including e-health initiatives as its research foci.
