

Highlights of the Year

- Mainstreet Medical Clinic: Strengthening the Patient Medical Home by embedding the Integrated Care Teams within the clinic. This has improved the patient and provider experience, improved communication across the provider spectrum and resulted in team-based care conferences for high needs patients.
- Vernon Seniors Action Network: The goal was to establish and foster a self- sustaining network of stakeholders that focused on enhancing the health and well-being of Vernon seniors.
- Collaboration with Vernon Family Resource Centre: Supporting LGBTQ / 2S community by developing referral pathways for physicians, providing physician and community education and support.






