Executive Summary

The purpose of the report is to provide an overview and analysis of the event and to serve as an historical record for reference purposes.

Summary:

A physician led planning committee was established to meet the College of Family Physicians of Canada's Mainpro-M1
accreditation eligibility criteria and to ensure the program and its content were relevant and meaningful to physicians
participating.

- The key objectives were to:
 - 1. Provide an opportunity for continued relationship building between family and specialist physicians
 - 2. Facilitate an interactive multi-specialty knowledge sharing session aimed at:
 - Closing a gap in patient care;
 - Reducing the need for a referral or visit to the Emergency Department or;
 - > Increasing the family physician's comfort in providing appropriate care in their own setting
 - 3. Promote the work of Partners in Care through updates on current and past initiatives
- By popular demand, the program for the event was modeled after the 2nd Annual Partners in Care FP/SP engagement event *Fishing for Pearls What you don't get told in medical school*.
- While all costs are not yet available, it is projected that the event will be under budget.
 Note: The budget included funding for a 1 hour sessional payment for those family physicians completing a post-event survey aimed at obtaining feedback and suggestions to help determine and prioritize future directions for the Partners in Care program. Results will be reported separately.
- The event was 4 hours in duration, of which the social portion was 2 hours. 2 Mainpro-M1 credits were provided.
- 482 invitations were sent to members of both Divisions. 12 specialists were recruited to share their clinical pearls and 13 new specialists to town were invited for the networking and dinner portion of the evening.
- 116 participants (including staff) were anticipated
 95 attended 17 no shows and 4 last minute cancellations
- Participating specialists were compensated for their prep time and 2 hours for participating in the small group discussions.
- 37 clinical pearls were submitted and many more shared during the rotating small group discussions



• 54 of 57 (94%) family physicians completed evaluation forms and 1 specialist with a 100% strongly agreeing/agreeing the event met their expectations

Engaging in the conversation – highlights:

- Performed by Drs. Fretz and Tevaarwerk, facilitated by Dr. Sealey with support from Terry Manzo
- The theme of the humorous interactive skit was FP/SP communication challenges. The skit incorporated an actual practice telephone message to demonstrate a typical source of frustration.
- Dr. Sealey engaged the audience at various intervals to ask questions and solicit solutions.



Fishing for Pearls and Digging for Nuggets session:

- Duration of the session 2 hours.
- 12 specialists, representing 8 different specialties, were divided into 2 groups. Each group had 6 tables of five seven family physicians and a specialist consultant.

• Each specialist consultant spent 20 minutes at each of the six tables within their designated group to share some pearls" of their specialty and answer any questions raised by family physicians. Different colour table cloths were used to identify each grouping of 6 tables.



- Specialists were asked, when selecting their pearls, to keep in mind that a desired aim of the knowledge sharing session was to:
 - Close a gap in patient care;
 - Reduce the need for a referral or visit to the Emergency Department or;
 - Increase the Family Physician's comfort in providing appropriate care in their own setting.



• 37 clinical pearls were submitted in advance of the event but many more were shared during the rotating small group discussion. A few specialists provided handouts.

Registration:

- To minimize the manual effort associated with a registration process of this size, an online registration service was used. The service provided:
 - A cost savings alternative
 - Personalized branding, invitations, confirmations and reminders
 - ➤ Ability to register directly from the email invitation
 - Web based registration tracking and flexible reporting etc
- On April 10, 2014, 482 email invitations were sent to the members of the South Island and Victoria Divisions of Family Practice. 74 FP seats were available, evenly allocated between the two Divisions.
- By April 16th, 70 of the 74 FP seats available were filled and a waitlist for Victoria Division members was created.
- It is interesting to note that of the 482 email invitations sent, 45% remained unread at the time of the event.
- 44% of FP registered themselves with 56% emailing or phoning support staff to register them.
- The 12 participating specialists (see page 3) were personally recruited by Dr. Tevaarwerk. The event lead extended 25 guest invitations to new specialists in town. 13 specialists, representing 9 specialties, were able to attend.




Q1. Have a good understanding of the objectives of the Partners in Care Program


Q2. Attended event primarily for networking

Q3. Attended event primarily for the "Fishing for Pearls" segment






Q5. Found the majority of pearls were meaningful and valuable


Q.6 Will be putting a number of the pearls shared into practice
