





#### **OVERVIEW** //

The Sunshine Coast Division of Family Practice represents physicians who support the communities along the lower Sunshine Coast, including Earl's Cove, Langdale, Madeira Park, Pender Harbour, Sechelt, Robert's Creek, and Gibsons.

Together, the members work to improve local primary care, increase local physicians' influence on health care delivery and policy, and provide professional support for physicians. Membership is open to all physicians practising or recently retired on the Lower Sunshine Coast, including specialists and locums. Incorporated in November 2011, the Division currently has 66 members, including 37 family physicians who practice in one of six medical clinics.

# MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR // A YEAR OF ENGAGEMENT

There is one way to describe the past year – increased involvement of physicians in working groups to improve patient care and physician satisfaction. We established a Patient Medical Home (PMH) Steering Committee to guide a number of initiatives and this group will also provide a link with the Primary Care Networks (PCN) that will involve the Health Authority. We are working with our Vancouver Coastal Division colleagues through the interdivisional council to ensure our interests are represented to the GPSC. As well, our local CSC (Collaborative Services Committee) has been expanded to include the PMH Steering committee co-chairs, a Facility Engagement Initiative rep and the local Medical Director, in order to shape our PCN priorities together.

We received a one-time fund of \$119,500 through GPSC to support enhanced PMH engagement with physicians in our community, and to engage with our community partners, specifically the Shishalh nation and patient engagement. Dr. Suzanne Walter is the engagement lead.

As the Board and staff changes - as committees and working groups evolve - we need to remain true to our roots as a Division of Family Practice. In 2011, the Division was created to reach an aspirational vision - that - "All citizens of the Sunshine Coast community will have access to quality, timely, sustainable local healthcare". The Division continues to be the voice of physicians in shaping how health services are designed and delivered in the Sunshine Coast.




