OVERVIEW // APRIL 2020 - MARCH 2021

The Sunshine Coast Division of Family Practice represents physicians who support the communities along the lower Sunshine Coast, including Earl's Cove, Langdale, Madeira Park, Pender Harbour, Sechelt, Robert's Creek, and Gibsons. Together, the members work to improve local primary care, increase local physicians' influence on health care delivery and policy, and provide professional support for physicians. Membership is open to all physicians practising or recently retired on the Lower Sunshine Coast, including specialists and locums. Incorporated in November 2011, the Division currently has 74 members, including 43 family physicians who practice in six medical clinics.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR // A YEAR OF COVID-19 – A YEAR OF RESILIENCE

When COVID-19 struck our province, our dedicated physicians joined together to ensure we had a plan in place for medical staff, clinics, hospital and residents. The COVID-19 Task Force was formed mid-March 2020 and was supported by the Facilities Engagement and Divisions of Family Practice who joined together to fund physician's time dedicated to COVID-19. As of March 2021, we are still in pandemic mode, albeit with hope that our increasing vaccination numbers will have an impact.

A year later, we are mindful that we will look back upon this historic, transformative and tragic year, and wonder how we did it. In ten, twenty years – what story will we share with family, friends, children, grandchildren? How we overcame adversity? How others did not? Will we dwell on the risks and fatalities? Or of the many lives saved? How we missed loved ones and felt the deprivation of the simple act of hugging a friend or colleague.

We know we will be sharing our story here on the Sunshine Coast. How our Physician Task Force came together to create a plan to ensure safety and medical resources. Many years into the future, people will recall "The RAC" as a symbol of local resilience and fortitude. A story of how we shared the burden of prevention with few tools and limited knowledge. A story of the entire community coming together in unimaginable ways. Oh, and definitely a story of the multitude of videos, skits, comedies, plays and occasionally totally awesome harmonies – all to keep us going, to remind us of our humanity.

At our virtual AGM in October 2020, we recorded a number of "firsts" – first Joint Division/MSA AGM; first virtual AGM; first honorary visit from Mayor Darnelda Segers, who commended the COVID-19 Physician Task Force and all physicians for their efforts to ensure the health and safety of Sunshine Coast residents; and first visit (virtual) from the Doctors of BC President, Dr. Kathleen Ross.

Throughout this year, all of our programs, staff, physicians and partnerships made a sharp pivot in response to COVID-19 as a priority. And yet, inspiring and foundational projects were initiated. The Primary Care Network (PCN) Steering Committee was successful in acquisition of a new primary care social worker. In response to the growing Opioid epidemic, the Addictions Working Group partnered with VCH to provide mobile outreach services and a virtual Opioid Clinic.

The Shared Care projects – Palliative and Seniors-Dementia Coordinated Care Working Groups both continued active engagement in specific projects. The Palliative WG hosted a series of educational workshops and partnered with community to identify gaps in services; the Seniors Working Group engaged with community partners to conduct a provider journey map and gap analysis. The Data Integration Working Group provided support for virtual care delivery in clinics. With leadership from Dr. Doris Fogarty, we were active at the interdivisional council to ensure our interests were represented to the GPSC. As well, our CSC (Collaborative Services Committee) launched a Primary Care Network Steering Committee, which hosted a "Family Feud" event to identify clinic priorities.

In January, the Executive Director announced her semi-retirement and the Board launched a recruitment process for the position.

At the writing of this report in October 2021, this community is still battling COVID-19 and the Overdose epidemics.




