FAMILY PHYSICIAN OR NURSE PRACTITIONER

If your concern is not critical or life-threatening, call your Family Physician first. They may have urgent same-day appointments available and should be offering in-person visits.

URGENT PRIMARY CARE CENTRE (UPCC) OR WALK-IN CLINIC

If you do not have a Family Physician or they are unavailable, try a UPCC or walk-in clinic.

PHARMACIST, 8-1-1 OR FH VIRTUAL CARE

For health advice, you can <u>call 811</u> to speak with a Registered Nurse. For urgent medication needs, contact your pharmacist or call 811 between 5pm and 9am. <u>Fraser</u> <u>Health Virtual Care</u> can be reached at 1-800-314-0999. They can connect you with the care you need and are open 7 days a week from 10am to 10pm.
