

Wound Care Event Survey Summary

Introduction

On February 23, 2023, the Surrey North Delta Division of Family Practice's "Coordinating Complex Care for Older Adults" Shared Care project hosted a CME event for local family physicians to learn more about wound care. 40 family physicians attended, alongside 3 residents, 9 CHNs, 1 SND staff, and 4 guest speakers.

Survey Findings

All 40 FP attendees responded to the post-event survey (100% response rate). Results indicate that the event met its learning objectives, with 100% of respondents agreeing or strongly agreeing that they have gained a better understanding of the basic anatomy of healing wound, they have gained a better understanding of the 4 phases of wound healing, and they understand the difference between acute wounds and chronic wounds, among other learning goals. - I gained a better understanding of the basic anatomy of healing wounds
 - I gained a better understanding of the 4 phases of wound healing
- I understand the difference between acute wounds and chronic wounds.
- I understand the different factors that may contribute to a non-healing wound.
- I feel confident discussing the goals of wound care with my patient.
 - I feel confident in diagnosing and treating diabetic / neuropathic foot ulcers.
- I gained a better understanding of the different types of wound care products.
 - I feel confident in diagnosing and treating peripheral arterial disease.
 - I gained a better understanding of how to balance moisture in wound healing.
- I feel confident in diagnosing and treating venous stasis ulcerations.
 - I feel confident that I know what type of wound care product to use at what time.

The survey also asked if the participants had an opportunity to learn who their Home Health CHN is, and **65% (26 of 40) of the respondents said, 'Yes'** while 20% (8 of 40) selected 'No', and 15% (6 of 40)

50% (20 out of 40) of the respondents strongly agreed with the statement "I enjoyed the format of the presentation." The format was lecture-style. (Fig 3)

When asked what the most valuable part of the session was, these were the responses:

- Wound care products (n=6)
- Information provided (n=5)
- Diagnosis and caring for wounds (n=4)
- Pattern recognition of types of ulcers (n=2)
- 4 types of wounds (n=2)
- Moisture information with wounds (n=1)
- Pictures shown during the event. (n=2)
- Management of certain wounds (n=2)

"Appreciated the discussion of different types of wound care products for moisture balance!"

"We always refer to complex wound clinic and it was nice to see Dr. Hwang and Corrine virtually in person."

Other information the respondents expected to learn during this session, but they weren't covered:

- Burn Care. (n=1)
- Other medication options that should or should not be used. (n=1)

Additional comments, feedback, or suggestions:

- Recommend reducing the introduction portion in beginning. 20min of introductions was noted to be a bit lengthy.
- Felt it was a lot of information in 1 hour and will need some time in practice to become proficient.
- Great session/ informative session. (n=7)
