Community Care Tip of the Month

Perinatal Services – Community Integration Health Services (CIHS) & community partners offer a range of services to new moms and babies. These are only a few of their services. Please click here to see the full tip of the month from Perinatal Services!

The *CIHS Public Health Maternity Care program* nurses contact all new moms within 24-48 hrs of discharge. Assessments are done over the phone with home visit follow-up provided as required and/or for any family that requests a home visit. This program provides regular and ongoing liaison with RIH. Families are subsequently referred to generalist Public Health Nurses for ongoing healthy infant and child development support, anticipatory guidance, and other services including immunizations, dental, audiology, and speech services. Routine hearing screening for all newborns is provided by Public Health audiology at RIH prior to discharge.

Kamloops is one of the communities identified provincially to implement the *Nurse Family Partnership Program (NFP)* this spring. NFP is an evidence-based, standardized, voluntary home visiting program providing enhanced follow-up to mothers who meet specific criteria. Some criteria includes first-time mothers, less than 25 years of age, before their 28th week of pregnancy. Public Health RN's, Susan Cumming and Deb Wongs will provide regular and ongoing follow-up with families from the prenatal period until the child reaches the age of two. This program is part of a research study in partnership with SFU and MOH. CIHS will be consulting with physicians this winter and spring to discuss this new program and appropriate referral processes. Planning is ongoing to dovetail with an IH wide initiative to create a centralized pre-natal registry in order to identify families who are eligible for the NFP and other prenatal supports.
