In Hospital Care Update

Goals for the present Memorandum of Understanding are presently being updated and will go through various channels including the Ministry of Health before being finalized. The next installment of MOU funding to those involved in providing "Most Responsible Physician" care to inpatients will be forthcoming once the goals have been finalized. Stay tuned for more updates!

Insulin Formulary Change

This initiative is a pilot within the Diabetes 3 year Strategy. Please find the Patient Safety Alert and other Trial information on the Division website here. This pilot is within RIH only at this time and is effective October 30th.

Trial of a new physician insulin discharge prescription form – Hope is to help facilitate discharge insulin orders and communications with community pharmacy, GP and other outpatient care team members.

Trial (only a couple RIH units initially) of new hospital insulin patient information sheet – Objective is information for patients/families regarding the insulin changes that may have taken place while in hospital, merely FYI for them and to further share with GP or outpatient care teams after hospital discharge.

Community Care Tip of the Month

The Community Integration Health Services team provides us with a Tip of the Month. This month is about P.I.E.C.E.S.

Increasing attention is being paid to the development of best practices for dementia and senior's mental health care. It is recognized that the Behavioral and Psychological Symptoms (BPSD) that can accompany dementias such as Alzheimer's disease can lead to increased utilization of acute care resources, antipsychotic medication and client/caregiver distress. The P.I.E.C.E.S. learning and development strategy (www.piecescanada.com) was developed to provide an approach to understanding and enhancing care for seniors with complex physical and cognitive/mental health needs and behavioral changes. This best practice tool has been taught throughout Canada over the past decade to many different sectors of the continuum of seniors mental health care ie. Acute, ER, residential and community.
