Integrated Practice Support Initiative

The Integrated Practice Support Initiative (IPSI) is designed to understand, improve and replicate alignment between the Divisions of Family Practice, Shared Care, Physician Information Technology Office (PITO) and the Practice Support Program (PSP). The Thompson Region and South Okanagan Similkameen Divisions of Family Practice are working together with physicians, specialists and affected stakeholders on an IPSI project. The focus of this work is on improving processes related to patients at risk or diagnosed with COPD. Activities to date include: finalizing a project plan, developing terms of reference and communication strategy, and delivery of physician focus groups in both Thompson and SOS to review and determine the usefulness of a variety of COPD tools and resources. The focus group information collected will be used to design a template that can be used by both EMR and non-EMR physician practices.

NEW! Endocrinology Telehealth Partners in Care

The prevalence of diabetes continues to rise and access to specialty services to meet this demand is a challenge within our region. This lack of access to specialty services creates many struggles for physicians, care providers, patients and their families. Over the next several months, with funding support from Shared-Care/Partners in Care, we'll prototype specialty consults with Dr. Charlotte Jones, Endocrinologist, to provide support to physicians, specialists, and care providers specializing in Diabetic Care in the Kamloops area. Key goals of this initiative include: Increase physician access to specialty services; Increase the skills and understanding related to endocrinology; Enhance the transition for youth with Type 1 diabetes to adult care; Ensure management of Gestational Diabetes is provided with support; Enhance support for management of more complex patients with diabetes; and, Improve the experience for physicians, care providers, patients and families. Further processes for FP to access this tele-endocrinology service will be developed and communicated to you all.

New Process for Home Health clients accessing Interior Health (subsidized) Assisted Living

In 2010 the Ministry of Health changed the policy on how Home Health clients in B.C. are waitlisted for Assisted Living sites (Home and Community Care Policy 5B1). The policy now states, "Health authorities must establish a process for determining which clients with equal need and urgency will have priority access to assisted living services."

As a result of this change in policy, the Health Authority will commence wait listing Home Health clients, who are eligible for assisted living services, by an urgency score as of Sept 30th 2013. A client's urgency score will be determined by the Home Health clinician during the assessment process.

In the event that two waitlisted Assisted Living clients have been assigned equal urgency scores, the Assisted Living suite will be offered to clients by chronological order. The chronological date is the date the client was placed on the Assisted Living waitlist. Clients receive the following information to help explain the process, please click here to view.
