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Child, Youth & Family Mental Health & Substance use collaborative

The CYMH & SU Collaborative is underway with the purpose of increasing the number of children, youth and their families receiving timely access to integrated mental health and substance services and supports. We have established a Local Action Team and a number of working groups to achieve specific objectives. Specifically, we are looking at simplifying and enhancing access, creating a more integrated team approach, communication across providers and capacity building and education for MHSU. Recently, Tara Mochizuki has been hired by the Division to take on a Project Lead role. She is looking to create a physician reference group to gather physician input on the various activities of the working groups and Local Action Teams.

Kamloops Healthy Weights for Children: Shapedown BC

A new program that offers support for obese children and youth in Kamloops, rates of overweight and obesity are rising among children. Within B.C., the prevalence of childhood obesity has risen to seven per cent. Research indicates that as many as 50 per cent of obese five year olds and 85 per cent of obese 15 year olds will become obese adults.

Interior Health's new Shapedown program brings families together for fun and interactive group activities twice a week over a ten week period. A team of health care professionals and exercise specialists will work to build on the strengths of families so everyone becomes healthier and happier. Families can achieve a more active lifestyle and healthier family eating, as well as increased self-esteem. The group treatment program operates in partnership with the Kamloops Community YMCA-
