A GP for Me A GP for Me is off and running with great momentum. This past month we have finalized our plan of approach and started getting down to the work of gathering data from various stakeholders. The "Day in the Life of a GP" office visits have begun with 5 offices being visited. These offer a wonderful way of observing the complexities of the day to day challenges faced by FP/GP's. We are holding several community and acute care focus groups to find out the challenges faced by our health authority partners, with respect to the unattached patient. We are having focus group and in person sessions with specialists, walk in clinics and other physicians to learn more from their perspective. The information gleaned from these sessions can provide valuable insight into the journey of the unattached patient and the burden of responsibility it leaves on care providers. Even though we are only in the data gathering stage on this initiative we are hearing about wonderful ideas and strategies that may provide answers to bridging some of the gaps in the primary care system. The Thompson/SOS IPSI Support Model Survey was circulated to the Division membership on February 12<sup>th</sup>.
