Whole Health Care, a private health care company in Kamloops, founded in 2013 by two Registered Nurses, Colleen Thom and Heidi Whiteaker. Through health challenges with loved ones, both women found a need to assist others with similar situations.

They offer services in "Health Mapping" and "Mobile Nursing Foot Care". Recognizing that foot care is not a regulated specialty as yet, both Colleen and Heidi are trained in Alberta, where standards for foot care are higher than in BC. In accordance with both BC and Alberta Infection and Prevention Control standards, they have chosen to deliver the safest care to their clients. All instruments used in their foot care procedures are "sterile to the point of use". Attention is given to the diabetic client and the high risk foot with referrals to other health care professionals as necessary. Heatlhy From the Start Effective Oct 15, Healthy From the Start (formerly known as the Prenatal Registry) program expanded IH wide. Healthy From The Start is a toll-free, confidential phone line service that offers health screening, information and referrals. Healthy From the Start connects pregnant women with appropriate services in their communities to help them have a healthy pregnancy. All women are encouraged to call early in pregnancy.

Physicians are asked to promote Healthy From the Start by sharing the contact information with all pregnant women using the business card and display information that was sent to all family and delivering physicians in October 2013. Clients can register by calling 1-855-868-7710, or online at www.interiorhealth.ca/HealthyFromTheStart. The service is offered Monday-Friday 8:30-4 PM PST. Referral forms are available if you have concerns that a woman may not call in but you would like her to be connected with this program.
