The Thompson Region Division of Family Practice is co-leading with Interior Health to develop a model of care for older adults with moderate to high complex conditions in collaboration with key stakeholders. The initiative aims to develop a new plan for a truly integrated system of health care for older adults in Kamloops as directed by the Ministry of Health. Nine other Divisions in the province, including Central Okanagan Division in Kelowna, are also working on models for their communities.

Dr. Phil Sigalet, Chair of the Residential and Community Care Committee, and physician lead for our Transitions in Care, Polypharmacy, and GPSC Residential Care Initiative, will act as Co-Lead on behalf of the Division, with Cathy Thibault as the Interior Health Co-Lead.
