Important Information Regarding Changes to BC **Palliative Care Benefits**

Please be advised about the recent changes to the BC Palliative Care Benefits. Of particular note is that the PPSv.2 is no longer being used as a prognostication tool for both malignant and non-malignant populations to determine eligibility for provincial palliative benefits. Rather, the SPICT tool (attached and embedded in the BCPCB registration form) is a reliable and valid tool for both populations for this purpose. Please note that these new forms are now in effect and old BCPCB forms will only be accepted to approximately the end of November 2015.



Nurse in Practice Engagement Event a Huge Success!

The Division hosted an event November 5th for physicians interested in learning more about introducing family practice nurses to their team. The project team introduced a toolkit that provides information on steps to consider when introducing a nurse into family practice. This includes an interactive business tool developed with Venture Kamloops that models a cost-effective impact a nurse would have on their practice. Thank you to everyone who attended! This project introduces nurses into physician offices as a way to ensure patients get the time and care they need; put more patients into physicians' offices for diagnosis; and ease the workload of physicians. In-office nurses provide education and support patients with chronic health issues, assist them in managing and living with their diseases, and help them find resources in the community.


look forward to hosting them in the near future.



The Division can help!

The Division has just completed a patient attachment system pilot project (see diagram below) that included creating a patient registry. This tool collects information from people who are looking for a family doctor. The Division uses the registry to refer unattached patients to a practice that has identified they have capacity for new patients.

Primary Care Transformation and Your Practice

Late June, and during the summer, many of you provided your perspectives on ways to improve primary care for older adults and your patients with chronic conditions, including mental health. Transforming Primary Care for Older Adults initiative, co-lead by Dr. Phil Sigalet and Cathy Thibault and supported by a diverse local action team. The team is currently working on an implementation plan for submission to the Interior Health Authority in early January and then to the Ministry of Health early in the New Year. Your Division will also work to submit a Shared Care proposal to the Doctors of BC to support the practice quality improvement aspects of this work. 
