Access to this service is through police referral, hospital referral, or client self-referral to 1125 Pembroke Street. The Community Medical Detox Unit is a 21 bed, short-term stay unit (approximately 7 days) for acute medical withdrawal. Stabilization Unit is a 22 bed unit (7 to 30 days) for stabilization and reconnection with community resources. Recovery Addictions Support (RAS) is a flexible day program for clients new to recovery. The program runs seven days per week and offers daily psychoeducational groups and complementary therapies.
