"Nesting Pregnancy" Prenatal Education Pilot Series For Expecting Families of the South Okanagan Maternity Centre a Success



The "Nesting Pregnancy" program, funded through the General Practice Services Committee (GPSC) and planned in partnership with the South Okanagan Similkameen Division of Family Practice, the Primary Care Network, and the Practice Support Program (PSP), offered a series of four virtual group prenatal education sessions for expecting families attending the South Okanagan Maternity Centre.

The non-traditional care delivery setting of a group virtual visit offered patients a safe environment during the COVID-19 pandemic and allowed for flexibility in location and timing compared to traditional in-person prenatal education classes.

The free Zoom series was well-attended by approximately thirty expecting families and covered a variety of topics, from eating well and staying active, labour and delivery, and newborn care/ breastfeeding/chestfeeding. Each session was led by a maternity clinic physician and co-facilitated by a guest speaker including a nutritionist, physiotherapist, lactation consultant, and labour and delivery nurse. The virtual presentations allowed group interactions through online polls and quizzes, and even a guided meditation. Patients had the ability to submit anonymized questions pertaining to the subject, allowing each member of the group to learn from the questions and discussions of others. After each session, attendees were provided with e-mail follow-up reading/resources, including information about community support options such as Okanagan Doula, La Leche League Breastfeeding Group, and more.

Following the successful pilot series, the "Nesting Pregnancy" team will work with key stakeholders to continue to offer this program and seek to extend the invitation to expecting families receiving (Continued on page 2)

Over four months, the Division's clinic support team, comprised of Kelly Hawes, Kristine Robbins, and Candace Gerk, worked with Desert Doctors to develop and implement an action plan to improve workflow efficiencies for the new EMR. Major components of this plan included data transfer, mapping paperwork for labs, designing reports, setting up billings, creating templates for
