What is your College saying?

In March 2017 ALL regulated health professions committed to a safer health system for First Nations and Aboriginal People by signing a **Declaration of Commitment** which was endorsed by the Ministry of Health and the First Nations Health Authority.

In May 2021 the Colleges of Nurses and Midwives, Dental Surgeons, Pharmacists and Physicians and Surgeons of BC issued a formal **apology** to the Indigenous people and communities who have experienced racism while engaging with these regulating bodies and the health professionals they regulate.
