What is Project ECHO?

Project ECHO is an evidence-based intervention that empowers health professionals to treat patients with complex conditions in their own communities. Targeted to **primary care providers and their teams**, participants regularly connect via videoconferencing with an interdisciplinary team knowledgeable in addiction medicine. Sessions provide lecture-style education on a given topic, followed by a **case presentation** and discussion.
