



Clostridium difficile Infection Information Sheet

- Clostridium difficile infection (CDI) is the number one cause of death due to infectious diarrhea and leading cause of healthcare-associated infection in Canada. The rate of community-associated CDI has increased and the incidence of multiple recurrent CDI has risen by 190% over the past decade.
 - Approximately 1 in 4 people experience a recurrence after initial CDI treatment and more than 60% will experience another episode CDI following 2 or more recurrences of CDI.
- CDI is diagnosed by combining clinical presentation of very loose to watery bowel movements several times per day, abdominal pain AND a positive stool CD toxin test.
- Treatment:
 - The current standard of treatment for recurrent CDI is prolonged course of oral vancomycin, which has limited efficacy
 - Fecal Microbiota Transplant or FMT uses stool from healthy screen donors to treat multiple recurrent CDI
 - Health Canada allows frozen and thawed FMT to be provided to patients with recurrent CDiff infection outside of research
- Research studies are using lyophilized or freeze-dried FMT to treat patients with recurrent CDiff infection and other clinical indications
