North Quadra UPCC Proposed Service Model

Key Principles

- The North Quadra UPCC site will offer Longitudinal and Urgent Care Services along with allied support.
- The proposed approach will maximize the floor space available at the North Quadra UPCC and further supplement this through off site longitudinal virtual care.
- An urgent care team consists of 1 primary care provider, 1 RN and 1 MOA (supported by a MHSU Clinician) with the primary care team, who are working both on and off site, consisting of 1 primary care provider ~.4 RN and .8 MOA.
- Physical space allows for 3 teams on site at any given time (2 exam rooms per team).
