How do I know if my clinic is ready for team-based care and participation in the PCN?

Answer

Engaging with a PCN Change Manager is the fastest way to get FREE access to tools and supports needed to answer this question!

The PCN Change Manager can facilitate a readiness assessment by working with your clinic to provide a clear picture of its current state and identify opportunities and readiness for change. Your PCN Change Manager will help you identify patient care needs in your clinic's panels to support the addition of team-based care. You will gain an understanding of the scope of activities a new team member can bring with support from Island Health. An overview of the different expectations and agreements that come along with the new team member will also be provided.

Once you have determined it's a fit for your clinic, the change manager will help you and your clinic secure a resource and think through a workflow for adding the team member. They will also provide a checklist of things to think about in order to get your clinic ready from EMR changes, to space and equipment and supply needs. As part of this journey they will connect your clinic with valuable networking and learning opportunities. They are also available to support you after the change as questions arise.

- Are you committed to moving your clinic to being a Patient Medical Home?
- Do you have a vision of what team-based care will look like in your clinic?
- Does your clinic have a team-based care champion who will act as an agent and sponsor for the change?
- Does your clinic have time, office administration and space for the change?
- Is everyone in the clinic ready and supportive of the change?
- Does your team meet at least once a month to discuss patient care?

Registered Nurses in the PCN

How can a PCN Registered Nurse enhance patient care in primary care settings you ask? A PCN RN can contribute to your practice by:

- Helping triage patients to determine the best provider
- Making sure your patient's health record is up to date, including family history and health goals
- Ensuring screening is up to date (e.g., pap screening, mammograms, bone density, screening for colon cancer)
- Assessing a patient's current health-care problems
- Helping patients manage their health concerns (e.g., diabetes, high blood pressure, lung problems) through provision of information and support
- Performing wound care and other health services
- Providing well-baby visits, developmental screening and prenatal visits
- Coordinating care when a patient needs to receive care in other parts of the health system or coordinating in-home support
- Reviewing medications and preparing prescriptions for review by a physician
- Preparing blood work requisitions and other requisitions for tests as required
- Working with a primary care provider as part of the care team to ensure that patient care is as complete as possible
- Follow up and monitoring of progress in a patient's care plan

Team-Based Care Grant

The Team-Based Care Grant provides a grant of up to \$15,000 to eligible family practices that have onboarded interprofessional team (IPT) members to help with costs of recruiting and onboarding IPTs into a practice.

The grant is provided for each full-time equivalent of net new eligible IPT positions filled by the family practice, which may be a staff member employed by the family practice, or another organization such as a health authority.
