

Provincial Attachment Strategy

Overview

The Provincial Attachment System (PAS), <u>announced</u> by the BC government and Doctors of BC, is designed to provide a coordinated and seamless approach to connecting patients who do not have a primary care provider with physicians and nurse practitioners who are able to take on new patients. It is another step in the journey to revitalize and strengthen family medicine.

The PAS will:

- Help unattached patients find a family provider.
- Help providers who are building new practices or expanding their panels.
- Measure system progress and identify capacity so that communities can more effectively plan for the future.

PAS will include all longitudinal family physicians regardless of their payment model.

Attachment Support in the South Island PCN

While our PCN team works to incorporate the upcoming system changes and enhancements connected to the PAS, we will continue to support attachment using the existing South Island PCNs internal workflows, processes and tools. During this transition period, the PCN will continue to send invitations and intake forms to unattached patients on behalf of member clinics to ensure a smooth transaction to maintain effective patient care.

Tips for Updating Your Panel List:

- Incorporate adding and removing patients into your daily workflows.
- Review your panel list in PAS regularly, at least quarterly, to keep it up to date and correct any errors.
- Note that your PAS password expires every 90 Days, so a quarterly review helps avoid password issues.
- You will see your submitted panel list within a few days of uploading or updating them via \$0 fee attachment code.
- Patient removals in PAS are effective immediately.

Cultural Safety

Over the last 6 months, PCN Cultural Safety Lead, Perry LaFortune has been out visiting clinics, establishing community partnerships with Indigenous Nations and organizations, other PCNs, and creating space for members and staff to learn and build relationships with Elders from the nine First Nations in South Island.

Some of the highlights of this work include:

- "A Dialogue on Culturally Safe Care" Traditional Healers knowledge share with Primary Care Providers
- "Heal the Healers " A panel discussion on how Traditional Healers care for themselves
- Elders visit SIDFP Staff at the Division office for a morning of learning and sharing
