The Ridge Meadows Division of Family Practice celebrates being seven years old and each year we feel a little wiser. Membership needs continue to drive our passion, vision and direction. The Strategic Advisory Committee and Board of Directors do an excellent job of keeping member priorities at the forefront of every decision made on behalf of our members to improve physician satisfaction.

This year we did an enormous amount of good work improving patient care in

response to physician requests. Residential care patients have benefited from regular visits from our physician on-call group. Children, youth and family caregivers now have access to a local psychiatrist for assessment and the Youth Wellness Centre so they can be quickly connected to counselling and other services. Frail elderly patients are a priority with a stronger care strategy at home through Home Health and the Senior Navigator partnership. Maternity patient care continues to be at the top of our physician recruitment list as we seek doctors with obstetrics interest so we can sustain this important service in our growing young family community.

The members voted to next prioritize improving patient care for adult mental health and chronic pain, while continuing our work in frail elderly and child/youth mental health and substance use (CYMHSU). The members also encouraged communication improvement between community doctors, hospital doctors and specialists. The Division completed inquiry work with physicians, our Fraser Health partners and community stakeholders.

The Division is hard at work supporting physicians to improve patient care through an abundance of education, technology support, recruitment/retention efforts and member engagement to build strength in relationships.

Supporting physicians with use of technology in their practice to improve patient care is identified as a continued

member priority year to year. Technology is constantly changing and we need to keep sharing tools that work and help to make things more efficient for physicians. We support physicians with their EMR needs, research new tools and applications to help physicians in their clinics and work with Pathways to provide a reliable, streamlined specialist referral database. We also work with a variety of partners such as the Practice Support Program (PSP), Pathways and Fraser Health Information Management/Information Technology (IM/IT).

# Initiatives: Complex Care and Community Attachment, Adult Mental Health Inquiry

Patient attachment has been a focus for physicians, Ridge Meadows Hospital and the general public. As we wrap up our work under the provincial A GP for Me initiative the Division remains committed to providing tools that support the attachment of patients in our community to family physicians. The Doc to Doc referral tool has a private listing of doctors accepting complex care patients referred from specialists and hospital doctors. We have worked closely

with the discharge and Patient Assessment and Transition to Home Unit – PATH unit of Ridge Meadows Hospital so patients could leave the hospital attached to a family doctor. The "find a doctor" websites are becoming a go-to tool for the general public to find doctors who are accepting patients. We continue to have billing support and education for members. The Division also received Shared Care Committee funding to support community research and inquiry, which enabled us to identify gaps in adult mental health treatment and produce a proposal request for a full project in the new fiscal year to improve patient care in this area.

# HEALTHY PRIMARY CARE PHYSICIAN Initiatives: MOA Network, Member Education, Physician Recruitment/Retention

MOA engagement and hosting an annual MOA-specific education event has been valuable to our members as we support their staff. Member education remains at the forefront to support physicians in their learning priorities locally, including CME opportunities. Fifteen education sessions were held with a variety of topics including technology, polypharmacy, dementia, medical marijuana and billing. PSP was a valuable partner with Musculoskeletal and Child and Youth Mental Health/Substance Use modules throughout the year. Physician recruitment continues to take the spotlight as many docs are planning retirement while our

population grows. The Division works closely with Health Match BC on prospects and continues to build on proactive recruitment efforts of our A GP for Me work, which included advertising, attending conferences and various campaigns. Physician retention is equally important and we host "club" meetings where physicians can connect and belong. We also offer a mentorship program and a Red Carpet Program, which is supported by local businesses who understand the needs of physicians who are new to our community. The Division continues to strengthen partnerships and advocate for continued recruitment funds for our community.

## PATIENTS SUPPORTED IN COMMUNITY

# Initiatives: Maternity Clinic, Frail Elderly, Residential Care, Child and Youth Mental Health and Substance Use, Chronic Pain Inquiry

Members continue to rely on the valuable services of the Maternity Clinic as our young family population grows and the Division focusses on recruiting physicians with obstetric interest. The Seniors initiative improved awareness of services, access, hospital discharge with service, living at home with support and communication improvement amongst providers including Home Health. A collaborative care model was launched with the new Seniors Navigator role available to patients and physicians, in addition to a future nurse strategy. Improving quality of care for residential care patients has been a strong initiative with 10 doctors sharing 24/7 on-call duties including proactive visits, meaningful medication reviews, improved documentation and case conferences. Piloting the Youth Wellness Centre with timely and easy access to mental health and substance use services was kept in action helping youth aged 8-24 years old and their families. The no-barrier centre offers education, group therapy, peer-to-peer support, child and youth psychiatry, sexual health, clinical counselling,

recreation, social services and a medical clinic. Youthwellness.ca was created along with inventory resource guides for service awareness. We received inquiry funding from the Shared Care Committee to explore chronic pain and opioid dependency and continued work to develop a frail elderly rapid response team concept. Proposals were submitted and approved to begin these projects in the new year. We continue to seek funding to support physicians and community stakeholders with the child and youth mental health and substance use work.

"The Residential Care Initiative (RCI) made significant improvement to Residential Care delivered in the Ridge Meadows area. It is now possible for care homes to be able to deliver better medical services and care to the elderly due to a robust and sustainable system of physicians being on-call. The staff feel well supported as they can access a physician at any time of the day or night."
