# PetalMD Expires August 31

For the last 3 years we have been able to support the use of PetalMD to primarily assist call scheduling and shift trades. As a physician only platform, it has offered you a secure messaging platform, a repository for clinical resources and Fraser Health Program changes.

Like most technological services, it is only as useful and effective as the number using it. With diminished users, the cost now outstrips the value; therefore, the Abbotsford Division group will be dissolved midnight August 31. If you have any information on PetalMD related to your Abbotsford account please download it before then.

The Division will be working with Fraser Health to initiate the utilization of MBMD this September. MBMD secure messaging platform will include GPs, consultants and the Home Health team (a limitation of PetalMD). It also provides the on-call contacts for the acute sites. Look for more information as we roll it out this Fall.

The Residential Care call group will be sent links to live calendars for scheduling. Shift changes are still processed by staff and a contact group will be initiated to allow for shift exchanges. We appreciate your support during transition and if you have any suggestions on improvement please contact Danielle.

# BC Cancer Abbotsford Pain and Symptom Management Clinic

BC Cancer Abbotsford Centre is excited to have recently welcomed Niki Sidhu, NP to our pain and symptom management clinic 5 days per week, in collaboration with Dr. Mark Ballard who supports the pain and symptom management clinic on Wednesdays.

Niki joins BC Cancer with a background in palliative care, having worked in palliative community nursing and the complex palliative unit and oncology inpatient unit at Abbotsford Hospital. The pain and symptom management and palliative care clinic brings compassionate, professional care to our patients to improve their quality of life. Niki supports patients that have a cancer diagnosis and have pain or other symptom management concerns related to their cancer, as well as advanced care planning.

In order to be seen in the pain and symptom management clinic patients need to have access to transportation and be able to get to and from the cancer agency. Niki works in collaboration with many partners including home health, primary care providers, and palliative teams within our neighboring communities. Niki also works to support patients with complex issues to avoid emergency visits and get the care they require by partnering with the palliative complex care unit, inpatient oncology unit, and various other areas of the hospital.

The pain and symptom management clinic is a short-term program that works in partnership with family practitioners to manage complex pain and symptom management issues in a collaborative supportive way with the goal of improving quality of life for those living with cancer. # ARH Medical Imaging Phone System Trial

Medical Imaging at ARH is working on improvements to their service and systems, and as part of this initiative they are introducing some temporary changes to the options offered by their phone system's auto attendant. This will help them with the demand analysis for their services.

It is important to highlight that the Medical Imaging phone number at Abbotsford Hospital remains the same: **604-851-4868**.

When calling Medical Imaging, they ask you and your team to please use the new option in their greeting menu, called **PHYSICIAN**. Once you reach the greeting menu and say **PHYSICIAN**, a selection of services will be offered.

Although all options will be routed to their reception with the same priority, the information collected through the use of the menu will help Medical Imaging to analyze the demand and better tailor services to the needs from patients and their care teams. The new physician option analysis will take place July 24 – Oct 31, 2019.

# Diabetes Clinic Update

On July 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Diabetes Clinic at ARH moved from its current location in Cardiac Rehab on Sumas 2 into the Shared Clinics on Sumas 1 to improve patient experience and care. Please note the **fax number has changed to 604-851-4774** (phone # is the same).

With this new set up, diabetes patients can now be referred to Internal Medicine for assessment. Patients will first be assessed by an Internal Medicine physician followed by a 30 minute appointment with an RN for diabetes education. Note: There will be no change to the RN and Dietician education provided to patients. The IM consult is an added value to ensure optimal medication management and blood sugar control.

The referral form is in the process of being updated, so please indicate clearly on the current referral form if you need Internal Medicine to assess a patient. The criteria for referrals is as follows:

Urgent Referrals Criteria (Aim: To be seen in 1-3 business days)

- New diagnosis for a client less than 30 years old OR
- Recent decrease in BMI OR
- Recent history of rapid weight loss
- New insulin start with A1C >9% A1C > 9% not initiated on any kind of pharmacotherapy
- Recent acute admission for hypoglycemic event (for non-new)
- Recent acute admission for hyperglycemia with diabetic ketoacidosis

#### High Priority Referrals Criteria (Aim: To be seen in 7-10 business days)

- Type 2: A1C > 9% with therapy OR RBG/FBG > 20mmol/L
- History of recurrent hypoglycemia or hypoglycemia unawareness

#### **Routine Referrals:**

• Routine clients are booked and attend self-management classes within 1 month OR may be booked and seen for a consecutive appointment if they are not eligible for a self-management class.

### **Residential Care News:**

#### **Key Contact for Bed Admissions**

All admissions to funded Residential Care beds in Fraser Health start with Fraser Health Home Health, who are responsible to do the necessary paper work and RAI assessment. Home Health then forwards this information to the Fraser Health Access Care and Transitions team.

Members are encouraged to talk to their Fraser Health Community Care Professional (CCP) Nurse / Primary and Community Care (PCC) Nurse to facilitate the admission of your patients to residential care. There are Home Health nurses that care for unattached patients.

#### **First Appropriate Bed Policy Changes**

The requirement for patients living in the community to take the First Appropriate Bed available in residential care will no longer apply, unless a patient is in the hospital / acute setting.

Patients can now choose up to three Preferred Care Homes that match their care needs; the expectation is that patients will receive information about care homes by the health authority.
